### Light, Enlightened and Enlightenment

Prior to 1717, many Masons were intellectuals that met in secrecy to discuss ideas of science, government and religion that were not acceptable to the powers that controlled



the world. In 1717, Masonry came out from meeting in secrecy. It is remarkable to recognize that Masonry came out at the beginning of The Enlightenment. Historians date The Enlightenment to have begun in 1715, the year that King Louis XIV of France (known as the Sun King as he built Versailles as the center of Europe) died. And continuing until 1789, the year of the French Revolution. The Enlightenment ushered in ideas centered on reason as the primary source of authority and promoted ideals like liberty, tolerance, fraternity, constitutional government and separation of church and state. The ideas of the Enlightenment undermined the authority of the monarchy and the Church and contributed to political revolutions of the 18th and 19th centuries.

Freemasonry espoused all of the philosophies and ideals of the Enlightenment and encouraged its members to pursue integrity, honesty, and love for all humankind. However, because they were a secret society, they were often misunderstood and persecuted, especially by the Catholic Church, whose power was waning as principles of liberty and equality became popular in Europe.

Some of the most famous and influential Masons of the 18th century were Voltaire, John Locke, Isaac Newton, Haydn, Mozart, George Washington, Benjamin Franklin, John Paul Jones, and Paul Revere.

The Enlightenment established the idea of the United States. If not for the prevailing thoughts of the Enlightenment there would not be the Declaration of Independence, nor the human rights and protections from government afforded to us in the U.S. Constitution.

### <u>Junior Deacon</u>

As we recently experienced the 2018 Vernal Equinox, most notably giving more Light of day to the northern hemisphere's diurnal rotation and signifying a new era of rebirth and a resurrection (conceptually) from a time of infertility, cold, and darkness. This event caused me to contemplate the necessity of contrast between Light and it's diametrically opposite pole, Darkness. In fact, as I began to perceive the lengthening of my evenings, I felt a decidedly pronounced joy! Presently, I found myself distinctly evaluating and asking myself - Why?

It seems almost a crude understatement to simply proclaim "there must be opposition in all things..." In search of a more profound perspective on the subject, I recently learned that the majority of vegetation growth on the planet occurs at night, when the Sun's Light is bidden elsewhere. In this same article, I learned that the abundance of our Sun's radiance throughout the day, actually impedes, or rather overrides, lesser waves of vibrations. For instance, radio wave transmissions increase in quality and strength as daylight lessens with the setting Sun and onset of night.

This made me consider the distinct correlation between Light and Knowledge that we, as Masons, revere. I couldn't help but be struck by the conceptual similarity of Light pollution, and the mind of an expert. The mind of an expert, regardless of specialty, is fully experienced, set, concluded, all knowing (at least from said expert's perspective). How easily can this individual absorb anything new on the subject of their given expertise? Whether by their own inability to accept that there may indeed be further light available in their field, or by true and actual omniscience regarding the thing - it is extremely difficult, if not impossible, for the expert to perceive additional insight amid the vast understanding presently accumulated. Curious then, that the Bible isolates the *inexperienced mind of a child* as the most distinct and elevated archetype for which we ought to aspire and emulate.

Still, this much is true - without presenting the exact circumstances requisite to impede the expert to a degree wherein he disregards all prior learning and experience, in order to look at the circumstance as an opportunity to, in fact, open his mind to the possibility of gaining new insight, expecting the expert to change is about on par with trying to see the stars via the naked eye, at High Twelve. Conversely, if the expert is removed from his familiar environment; provided with new information, which has little or no resemblance to his previous experiences; and finally, when he is significantly handicapped, his tools are removed, his resources relinquished... What then, might we expect? It is often difficult to understand why we require that God cripple us before we progress, often before we can even perceive the lesson. On the other hand, how much more difficult is it to voluntarily strap on our own blinders; to see the forest for the trees, as it were? Furthermore, how often do we remember to profess our gratitude to our creator, for providing us with a life and environment, perfectly designed to offer us, a tailored experience, rife with the exact circumstances necessary to open our limited perceptions? And moreover, how do we express our gratitude for the Light that only toil...toil through the difficulty, blindness, and inability provides? Do we share it with one another? Do we take the time to tell one another how our tribulations have built our understanding? We never know, what Light God may bestow on a beloved Brother, simply because we were willing to share.

My Brothers, as Masons we recognize the necessities and even blessings of opposition and polarity in our lives. Let us more often to raise our voices with gratitude for our difficulties as well as our achievement in overcoming them and the Light we are afforded thereby. I believe that this year will bring growth and refinement to OUR Lodge through each and every one of us, as we **Step Up!** and work to enhance our own Light and share it in humility, we will unavoidably enhance all things Masonic...all of the things that we know, love and defend as Brothers of Scottsdale 43!
