NAME





'Tis the season for reflection; it seems we've all been taking inventory of the year and the lessons and experience we have learned and gained, through our thrilling successes and in our sobering losses. As I reflect on my own year - as a father, husband, brother, son, Mason, coworker, leader and/or any of the other roles that might I play on any given day - I realize that gratitude or rather, the act of expressing it, is the single most powerful action we can perform, in favor of our own health and happiness.

Furthermore, it is also one of the most difficult behaviors to embrace, when life is challenging us through adversity! Earlier this year, as I was facing some extremely difficult days in recovering from my neck surgery. On one of these difficult days, I found myself thus ranting to my wife about how hard I was working to correct my outlook and perspective, after feeling significant loss in some of the ways that I expect my body to function. She reminded me that focusing on the strife and difficulty of my situation was not likely to help me in my efforts to find peace and contentment in my circumstance. Conversely, if I were to focus on the blessings that God has unceasingly bestowed upon me and my family throughout this tribulation, I would likely not only find that I am focused on happier elements throughout my day, but I would also be much more respectfully inviting of Deity to sprinkle more of these into my life.

I could hardly stand the idea of trying to contrive such sickeningly-sweet ideas, given my frustrated state. Still, I could not refute the truth in her words. So, daily I would write, in a specialized journal, at least three things for which I was genuinely and superfluously thankful. Daily, as I would sit down with pen in hand full determined, that is when all my frustration would come crashing down on me. My mind and emotions feeling completely bound up in a tangled mess of knots! I would forcibly will myself to write something, anything...anything I could think of. Then it would happen, moment by moment with each each stroke of the scripted letters, I would feel the discord

sorting and the tangled mess inside me, unwinding and folding neatly. As I sit here this morning, looking back at those pages, I have to laugh at myself for the all of the moments I *still* forget how powerful this tool/habit is for my life. And those pages in that journal are indeed irrefutable evidence of that fact. As I said, I charged myself with writing at least three things for which I was truly grateful; yet today, there is not a single page of writing in that book with fewer than ten!

My Brethren, every one of those pages holds almost exclusively names. Many of your names are among them! I am grateful for each of you! I am infinitely thankful for the lessons that each of you bring, exemplify and aid me through, whether you've been aware of it or not, you have, every single one of you - has taught me and thereby earned a place of deepest gratitude in my heart.
