This month, I wanted to do something a little bit different. In lieu of Bro. Robert Burns Birthday this past month, January 25th 1759. I wanted to share with you a poem by him for your enjoyment. As you may know Robert burns is



one of the most celebrated masonic poets in the world and his poetry was said to have influenced Abraham Lincoln in his efforts to win the civil war and abolish slavery. Robert Burns was initiated on 4th July 1781, in St David's Lodge, No, 174 Scotland, Tarbolton. He was passed and raised in the same Lodge on 1st October 1781, and he passed away July 21st, 1796.




