<u>GREETINGS</u> FROM THE WEST

During this long duration spent at home I've had a lot of time to think and read about masonry and came across an amazing article written by Sir Knight David E. Stafford, that describes some of the more esoteric symbols that might be



overlooked throughout the degree. One of which is the elements. Earth, Wind, Water, and Fire. Over the next few months I will share an annotated version of each of these elements edited down as to not reveal too much from our ritual. I want to begin with fire being that we have all gone through something terrible, a life changing event,, and are now about reemerging from it changed.

Fire.

To the ancient Hebrews and to alchemists, fire was the most active of the elements. It was fire that served as a catalyst. According to Vorhand-Ariel, "Heraclitus regarded fire as an agent of transmutation and as a symbol of renewal, representing light, spirit, the sun, radiance, and purification". The alchemists used fire as well as water as a source of purifying their tools. The alchemist and metallurgist both used fire to refine metals and make them pure. It separates the base from the precious metal. Fire was used by them to transform a crude convoluted mixture into a separated collection of base and precious metals. "The Zohar says that the flaming sword (referred in Genesis as being placed east of the Garden of Eden) symbolizes the trials with which God overwhelms man that he may be purified and restored to the way of goodness". It might be mentioned here that the tiler's sword was traditionally wavy in shape to represent the sword placed in the Garden of Eden. As aforementioned, fire is a symbol of renewal and has been since time immemorial. Perhaps one of the

best images of this is the traditional phoenix.

The phoenix is a mythical bird that after an extensive life combusts into flames and is reborn from its own ashes. Thus Spake Zarathustra, Nietzsche wrote, "You must be willing to burn in your own flame: how could you become new unless you had first become ashes?".

The ancients implemented a trial by fire perhaps similar to Pike's variation of the Entered Apprentice degree. Perhaps it is a reminder to the neophyte that he must set aside or destroy his old image of life and self to receive the teachings of Freemasonry and become a new and better creature.





Masonic Fundraiser Activities are based upon Masonic Relief:

Masonic Relief

Relief is a form of charity. It is a means to help our fellow man, who, no matter how industrious and frugal he may be, through sudden misfortune, or other conditions over which he has no control, may be in temporary need of a helping hand.

Relief for the misfortunate did not begin with Freemasonry. You will find it written in the holy scriptures of holy books of all religious faiths.

It can be found several hundred times in the Christian Bible. It is in the Torah, the Prophets, in the Gospels and in the Epistles.

Luke 6:38 For if you give, you will get!

Your gift will return to you in full and overflowing measure, pressed down, shaken together to make room for more, and running over.

Whatever measure you use to give,...large or small,...will be used to measure what is given back to you."





Scottsdale Lodge library has many interesting articles accumulated over the years. One reminds us of the history of the U.S.A. On April 30, 1739 General George Washington was to be sworn in as the first president of the U.S. This was to take place in Federal Hall in New York N.Y. The general claimed no oath would mean anything if it was not taken on a Bible. Federal Hall had no Bible, but WM Jacob Morton of St. John's Masonic Lodge was in attendance and he ran to the Lodge and returned with the Lodge Bible. The Bible has become famous and is known as the George Washington Bible. Many presidents have requested to be sworn in on this Bible. It travels only with four lodge brothers and does not fly. George Bush requested it and on one occasion it was sprinkling rain and although it was there the brothers refused to take it out in the rain. Now for the connection to our library. When our brother WB Dave Woodland was sworn in as chaplain of the Grand Lodge of N.J. the Bible was there for the occasion. A picture of this occasion is above he desk in our library. WB Dave has something in common with a number of presidents of the U.S.A. The Bible was also used at George Washington funeral and the dedication of the Washington monument.


