




There's more to Prudence than just the practical example, and I missed that part in my considerations. The presentation doesn't need to deep dive into a sublecture in Prudence, but I needed to consider this more carefully. With some keyword searches and some reading, I stumbled across an article on Prudence that seemed to reflect and even summarize my thoughts.

"The word 'prudence' is used in several ways in contemporary English, and its different philosophical senses to some extent reflect that variety. Traditionally, Prudence is the ability to make morally discerning choices in general; but the term is also used to denote a habit of cautiousness in practical affairs; most recently, attempts have also been made to identify Prudence with practical rationality, perhaps even with the pursuit of the agent's own interests, without any specifically moral implications."

Morally discerning? Cautiousness in practical affairs? Practical rationality? Pursuit of interests without moral implications? What was this crazy talk?

However, I believe this author might be on to something, and that something might help Masons like me looking into the Cardinal and Theological Virtues. Practicality, morality, and cautiousness don't just pop out of thin air. We must work toward sharpening skills here, or in other words, we have been given working tools to assist us in bettering ourselves.

Bettering our skillset with regard to Prudence comes down to understanding three things about our own behavior, and this applies to each of the virtues. We have to gather knowledge. This can be an instantaneous snapshot from childhood warnings to look both ways before crossing streets, or it can be walking into a

building and scanning for threat assessment – is there

anyone here who potentially poses a threat/what is that threat? We apply our own acquired knowledge, hopefully as wisdom, toward this assessment of any given situation. We now make a decision based on our best judgment, and then we act in the best manner we can achieve—a little more on that.

FROM THE LIBRARY

I normally write about a book from the library or about something new in the Library. This month I am writing about a pamphlet that came to the library, that came to us from the estate of Brother Gary Underhill. Since I became a Mason I have been hearing about a number of Papal Bulls. I have been interested in reading these, but never came across one until now. This pamphlet is an official document of the Supreme Council of the Southern Jurisdiction of Scottish Rite of Freemasonry It was first published in its Transactions of 1884 as part of The Allocations of Sovereign Grand Commander Albert Pike

Beginning in 1738 and continuing, several of the popes have attacked and denounced Freemasonry. The one pronounced by Pope Leo XIII in 1884 was so false that Pike could not remain silent. Pike said it was not only a brutal attack on Freemasonry, but an attack upon the human race and progress,--"A war against constitutional government and freedom of conscience and Freemasonry, as their defender"

General Pike's reply is not only a masterpiece of dignified and scholarly argument in defense of the Masonic Order, but he volunteered to plead the case for all mankind civilization. It is a brilliant of literature and forensic oratory.

This is a great read and will be in the library shortly.

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

Note: Insurance riders would probably be needed.



Masonic Education

We Masons Are a Peculiar Bunch!

As I read through Masonic Ritual there are, from time to time, individual words that stand out in a peculiar, or particular way. One of those words, often misunderstood, is "peculiar," which is often misunderstood as first and foremost meaning "strange, odd, or curious." In the sense of the application of the word to Freemasonry, I think the best definition is the first one we find in Merriam-Webster's dictionary, which is "characteristic of only one person, group, or thing: distinctive."

We Masons are a peculiar bunch, aren't we? Most fraternal organizations in the United States, such as the Elks, the Moose, and the Eagles, are informally bound to some moment of ritual; here I'll cite the American Legion which uses the Pledge of Allegiance followed by the Preamble to the Legion's Constitution – but then they default, almost completely uniformly to Robert's Rules of Order.

Not Masons! We are a peculiar bunch. We have a ritual that guides our entire proceedings. From start to finish in our meetings we operate with a particular set of guidelines to be found in no other organization. When we are conducting business, the ritual is ever there to guide us. Sure, there are many elements of Parliamentary Procedure which we may at times leverage, but in a well governed Lodge we have harmony, and the unwritten rules of dignity, respect, and decorum rule the day, and we have no need for the many encumbrances of Robert's Rules.

Election of candidates to those other organizations is generally a majority rules affair, with anyone who meets basic criteria drawing the general approval of the majority, and thereby being allowed to join the institution with no expectation that one will comport themselves with any kind of ideology while outside the organization. There are almost no expectations that a person affiliated with any of the Animal fraternities will be an Ambassador of the organization while abroad in the world

Not Masons! We are a peculiar bunch. Our behavior outside the Lodge affects the way the public thinks of Masonry in ways that no one ever applies to any other fraternity. We have an expectation that all members of

any Lodge to which a candidate (or even a Brother!) may apply, on the night of his election, MUST cast a vote, for the good of the Lodge, and for the good of Masonry. Once elected, we police one another's conduct, to see that each of us improves the other and maintains some of that Masonic bearing which we were taught as Entered Apprentices. We expect each other to act in accordance with certain virtues, tenets, and in respect of certain beliefs. We expect that each of us will act as builders of a house which none of us can see, but in which all of us hope to one day live.

So, as you move through your day, today, and every day, remember just how peculiar you are, because of Masonry, and let that peculiarity radiate from you, and outward, into the world.


Elections are not far away.....
