Words From the South

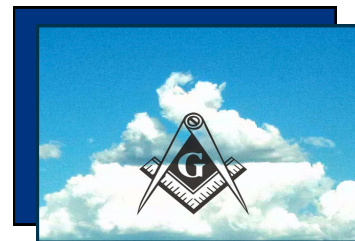

Over the next few issues of our Trestleboard I will be analyzing the prayers we use during Lodge, without directly quoting the ritual of course. Fraternal Greetings & Salutations Brother Sir Knights of the Order,

The good Editor Peter Johnson requested from me an article any time I would so wish to stare once more at that giant unblinking eye before me, the computer monitor pondering what subject to dwell on. I was somewhat surprised by his request, as every article I had ever submitted to his good offices while serving in the Grand Commandery Line, was on the last day of the deadline submissions and usually during the last hour before the clock struck midnight. I have also have received a number of emails and commits from Brother Knights who said they had enjoyed my articles in the past. The strangest commits were from those who know me, which were to the effect, of my often being a different person in my writings, then I appeared to be in person!

The New Worshipful Master has requested I once again handle the Friend to Friend meetings for Scottsdale 43. As there is usually six to a dozen at the weekly Friend to Friend meeting, which is held the same time as Scottsdale Lodge weekly meetings, it works out well for these men seeking knowledge of Free Masonry. Plus, these seekers of the Light have a chance to help in the kitchen and meet the Brothers of the Lodge, if they so desire. We at Scottsdale Lodge have found this to be a winning proposition for both the Lodge and possible future Masons of the Lodge, whom do not know a Mason to be recommended by.

I have over the years stressed after the new Mason has received his Degrees, he has a life time of searching for Masonic Light before him. He should make himself busy in service to the Lodge and in time if he wishes prevail upon himself to seek membership in other Masonic Bodies, such as the Scottish and York Rite Rites, the Shrine and or one the many other Bodies Free Masonry has to offer to expand his Masonic Knowledge. Plus, if he be married the Bodies open to both he and his wife and children. I am a big proponent of the many different Bodies open to the entire family of a Mason in good standing. I stress both the Rites as good choices to began with, after he is comfortable with being a Master Mason and wishes to expand his knowledge of Masonry. As I am a proud member of both Rites, and both have much to offer Masonry in knowledge and service to the Craft. The easiest to explain is the Scottish Rite is more concerned with the New Testament and the York Rite searches the Old Testament for example and lesson, plus Masonic ties to the Knights Templars. Both Rites will greatly aid with the quest of a life time in the seeking the Light for the building of one's own Temple.

The next question almost always asked is, the costs of joining the Rites, because of the expense of having to pay for the Knight Templars uniform, hat, sword and so forth. To be frank, this question has troubled me for many years, as the facts are; outfitting a new Templar is expensive. So the vast majority usually decide to first go into the Scottish Rite, if for no other reason that the dictation of COSTS being the deciding factor. I have pondered this question for years, and come up with no good answer for it, except, each Commandery usually is able to aid the new member with a sword, tunic (if they have any spares) and same with the hat.

But, the facts are it is expense to become a outfitted Knight Templar. Plus, the joining and dues are usually more expensive in The York Rite. The facts of the York Rite being an extension of the Blue Lodge both here in The United States and Canada, goes without saying. As both Countries fall under English Masonry for their WORK, and English Masonry in practice is York Rite Masonry! So the fact is the New Mason just receiving his Third Degree is in truth already a York Rite Masson, and I believe in England the Master Mason also receives the Fourth Degree of Mark Master in his Lodge, while in the USA and Canada the Fourth Degree of Mark Master is given as the first degree (or the Fourth Masonic Degree) received when joining the York Rite. Just as the first degree received in the Scottish Rite is the Fourth Degree.

I believe the York Rite should be offering membership in each of it's three Bodies, and a candidate can be able to join just the First Body of the York Rite, the Chapter, before committing to join all three Bodies of the York Rite. The Chapter with the Royal Arch Degree is some of the most beautiful Degree work in all of Masonry. Once the new member has become use to working and meeting in the Chapter, he can then proceed to join the next Body of the York Rite the Council. Where he again can become use to the Work and meeting in the Second Body of the York Rite, before choosing to seek admittance into the Knights Templar, or the Third Body of the York Rite. I realize this may set the York Rite on its head and cause members to have to put in more time and work, then that which is now being done. We all know the state of affairs of the three bodies of the York Rite and the Work being done in the monthly meetings.

The Scottish Rite sometimes spreads out receiving all of the degrees at one time and half are given and in six months the remaining degrees are offered. The new members are 14th Degree Scottish Rite members and can attend meeting and do work during the time spend waiting the six months until receiving the rest of their 32 Degrees. I have observed this in practice and it appears to work very well, as they are also offered membership in the Knights of St. Johns and able to do all the Work entitled to a member of the 14th Degree.

Where has all this rushing in the past decades gotten our Masonic Bodies? A century ago, one has to be a Past Lodge Master before being able to join the York Rite. In the Scottish Rite Degrees were given one degree at a time. Before this modern era, a Mason had to know the Work in each degree he entered, before being able to receive the next advanced one. But times change, now it is possible to receive the three Lodges Degrees in one day, and the York or Scottish Rite Degrees in a weekend. Those whom choose may still study and seek the Light of Masonry. But, what of those whom would have been exposed to the Light, if we moved a little slower in giving the Degrees.

I pose the above question for the York Rite, as a new avenue of approach for membership, which may have been over looked. Instead of offering membership in all three Bodies of the York Rite, let the new member belong first to the Chapter, then the Council and lastly to the Cammandery. Let us try a new idea of letting them first progress in the work within each of the three Bodies. Let us slow down the pace, for membership, before we do so good we stay the same course we are now on, and put ourselves completely out of business of the York Rite. And I think also of the Scottish Rite, as I love the Scottish Rite as well as the York. Both Rites have so much to offer the seeking Mason, and they hold the Beacons of Light and Freedom for the entire World to See!


