The Mentor Training program has begun and will proceed every other week on Thursday at 5pm. The 1<sup>st</sup> topic was on the mentor's role between the time the candidate is elected and when they receive their 1<sup>st</sup> degree. Per the Candidate Education booklet there are exercises in the form of lessons which should be covered. ## Words From the South

His Jewel of Office is the **Plumb**,... which is a stonemason's instrument used for ascertaining the alignment of a vertical surface.

It symbolizes **upright behavior** among Masons.

The Junior Warden of a Masonic Lodge is the third in command of the Lodge. The Junior Warden sits in the South (symbolic of the position of the sun at midday) and is responsible for the Brethren while the Lodge is at ease or refreshment.

His position is similar to a Second Vice-President. The Junior Warden, too, may open the lodge if the Master is unable to attend the meeting.

It is the Junior Warden's duty to arrange meals for the lodge. Symbolically, it is also his duty to make certain that the members do not convert their refreshment into intemperance or excess. This is a holdover from earlier days, which still remains as part of the Junior Warden's job description, even though in most U.S. jurisdictions, alcohol is barred from the lodge.

As always, I will be open to suggestions for meals and will greatly appreciate any kitchen help that you might be able to offer. Whether it is helping with the preparation, serving the Brothers, clean-up or even if you would like to be a "Guest Chef".

## What if Christopher Columbus were a Knight Templar?

## From the Editors desk

### Thoughts on Wise Counsel

With the fifth point of fellowship, we are encouraged to give wise counsel to our Brother Freemason and to support him in his time of need. In Ancient Craft Masonry, the hand symbolized the support, while the whispered counsel, if found worthy, was equally common. The key is to see the responsibility of communicating good advice and providing support and help in implementing that advice. No matter who we are, we will need some help at some time, and, as Freemasons, we should strive to be available to offer our assistance to others when needed. This can have different interpretations in its meaning, but I want to share my personal thoughts on this within our lodge.

As a DeMolay over 50 years ago, I was taught the Master Counselor and officers of the chapter came up from the ranks and then returned to the ranks after their term of office. This is still true today within a lodge of Master Masons. First on the lodge level, I hear some brothers spending much time complaining about the actions of current officers, because they are not content with an action or decision. Some of these same brothers' whether sideliners or past officers voice their discontent to small groups or everyone within earshot, except directly to the individual or WM, instead of sitting down one on one, providing Wise Counsel and finding out why and how certain decisions were being made. We need to be mindful of the responsibilities that a sitting Master has taken upon himself with the approval of his lodge brothers. Members of the lodge are then looked to by every Master and the officers for Wise Counsel during their year. It is through this Wise Counsel that the Master is helped to make his decisions for the benefit of the lodge as a whole.

As we journey through Masonry, Wise Counsel to is not meant to be only for airing personal complaints, it should be to help improve our lodge and to help our brothers benefit from positive thoughts and ideas on a personal level as well as for the lodge itself. As men we see different ways of getting to the same place or goal and sometimes the process of getting to that goal is not what we individually, would choose to do. That is why the final decision must be left to those given the authority by virtue of the office they hold to make that decision.

On an individual level a brother should feel comfortable in asking another for Wise Counsel without hesitation and knowing that that discussion will be kept in confidence. A brother seeing that another brother appears to be in need of Wise Counsel shall not feel any hesitation to approach that brother and ask if he can offer some help or Wise Counsel. We are a fraternal family of brothers from many backgrounds and with a wide range of ages and life experiences. While we will have occasional disagreements, as Masons we should always come together as brothers to mutually resolve them.

## SCOTTSDALE MASONIC LODGE #43

### Greetings & Salutations my Masonic Brothers of Scottsdale Lodge # 43. how good it is to be among the brethren.

The Worshipful Lodge Master has task me to write a short article about the York Rite Bodies, which meet at the Lodge building and call Scottsdale their home. In a matter of fact, we are known all over the State as the Scottsdale York Rite Bodies, not by our voted on name of The Goldwater York Rite Bodies. I have been attending Scottsdale Lodge going on twenty five years now, and I would say for the first four or five years I was not even aware of what the York Rite was, much less than a chapter of the York Rite held meetings monthly at the Lodge building. I had noticed the large stone arch behind the Worshipful Masters Chair in the East, but never gave it a thought of why it was there. None of the York Rite members wore their red Chapter, purple Council or black Knight Templar jackets, as is often done now days at open Lodge meetings, to suggest an interest in and pride of the York Rite to their brother members of the Lodge.

So please let me take a few minutes of your time and attempt to explain what the York Rite here in Scottsdale is about and does in action. The York Rite is divided into three bodies and when a new members joins, he first goes into the Chapter and becomes a Companion to his York Rite Chapter Brothers. His first degree received is that of Mark Master, being one of the quarrymen working on square hewn stone works for King Solomon's Temple. The second degree is the Past Masters Degree, as until recent times, no Mason could become a member of the York Rite unless he was first a Worshipful Master of a Masonic Lodge. Thus by receiving the Past Masters Degree, a modern Mason can now be advanced to the degree of Mark Master and enter into the York Rite. The most breath taking degree I have even witnessed is the last degree given in the Chapter, which is the Royal Arch Degree (there is that Arch behind the Master's chair again), when the new member receives the lost Holy of Holy's WORD. In my opinion there is no man whom has received this Degree, which was not moved by it.

The Council or Cryptic Mason is the second part of the York Rite. The degrees of the Council dwell into the building of secret chambers of King Solomon's Temple and Palace where the most prices objects could be hidden when need be, and none but the Select Masters would ever have knowledge of the same. Upon completing the degrees of the Chapter and Council, the York Rite Brother Companion can then received the Orders of Knighthood from the last Body of the York Rite, which is the Commandery of the Knights Templar. But, before becoming a Knight Templar the Companion of the Royal Arch and of the Council will first receive the Illustrious Order of the Red Cross, The Mediterranean Pass and Order of Malta, by traveling a rough and rugged road, when both mind and body are both tested and the Companion becomes a true Pilgrim of our Savior Jesus Christ.

Upon becoming a true Pilgrim of Christ he can be presented to a Commandery of Knights Templar for entrance, where the Pilgrim is once again tested for his endurance and faith to the Cross. After completing his test as a true warrior of Christ, the Pilgrim is once more brought before a Commandery of Knights Templar where he must swear on all things Holy, that he is willing to lay down his life if need be in the defense of the Christian Religion and/or Defender of the Faith and Western Civilization.

Scottsdale Lodge has also been home to Three Past Grand Commanders of Arizona. The last being myself Sir Knight Terry Kelly for the term of 2013 to 2014. I hope this short article can provide my Scottsdale Lodge Brothers an insight into what we Yorkies are about and what we do here in Scottsdale. And, remember we are always on the lookout for good Masons whom would like to be advanced into the York Rite and aspire to our way of beliefs. If you are a lover of History, I can think of nothing better than our History as Knights of the Temple and Defenders of the Faith!



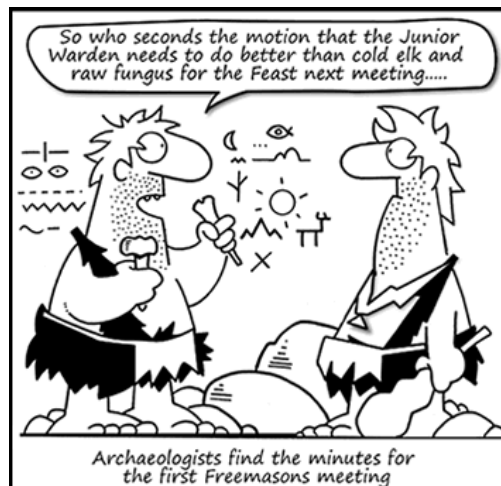
