Kinishba Court would like to thank all those who attended the Christmas in July Diabetes fundraiser. It was a great success. We look forward to continuing this tradition in the future.

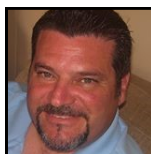

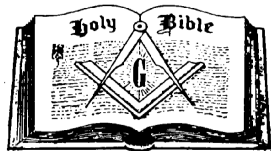
Arizona Masonry is in mourning following news of the passing of Right Worshipful John Engstrom.

The Grand Lodge of Arizona extends it's condolences to family, friends, and those who called him brother.

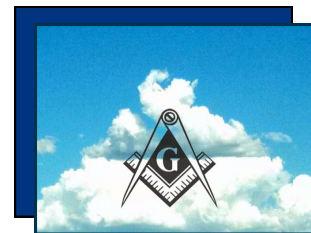
