



SPECIAL MESSAGE FROM THE WORSHIPFUL MASTER



Brethren of Scottsdale Lodge,

As some of you may have learned, we experienced a tragic incident at the Lodge building, on Saturday Dec. 16th during our Masonic Breakfast event. While the details of the event will be the subject of ongoing investigations and subsequent trial and I ask that we not dwell on repeated discussion of them, the basic circumstances were as follows:

A certain Seeker (Friend to Friend Attendee) had recently begun to exhibit signs of emotional distress, both within and outside of the lodge. He was issued an official email from the Master and Wardens, asking that he cease and desist all contact and not to return to the lodge. The man's distress escalated into an outburst causing some significant fright to the attendees of our breakfast. Because the behavior had been identified early and the possibility of an outburst was known among the officers, all present were able to take swift and decisive action, to keep everyone safe and appropriate officials were immediately contacted and involved. The situation was defused relatively quickly but will have ongoing ramifications.

The results of the incident are: the man in question was arrested and has been charged with a number of criminal acts toward the lodge and several of our patrons. He is currently in county custody and will remain, as psychiatric assessment and assistance is carried out. The lodge has received good communications with regard to his status and will be notified as the proceedings continue.

Of course, it goes without saying, the safety of our members and their families is our first and utmost priority and we are grateful that early signs were identified and communicated swiftly and efficiently. This leads us to continue in, greater depth, the conversation which began at our last meeting, regarding the security of the Lodge and our personal safety and wellbeing. This is also in keeping with the most recent communication from our Grand Master MW George R. Rusk on the subject of security and emergency preparedness and planning.

Therefore - our second Thursday of January (01/11), rather than degree work, we will hold a Special Meeting in the form of an education night. The effort will be facilitated by our newly formed Security Committee - and will include the following aspects Legal Aspects/Liabilities, Preparation, Emergency Action Plan, and Objectives to be addressed.

Please join us for this very important evening!




